MODIFIED DUTY DESCRIPTIONS

1.	COMMUNICATIONS DUTIES - Sitting at watch desk answering the telephone, receiving fire calls and relaying alarms to personnel. Operating doors by using button to open and close. Keeping Daily Log up to date. This is a desk job. Very little physical exertion. None of these duties ever require firefighting.
2.	INSPECTIONS - Under the direction of the Fire Prevention Officer (FPO), assist the FPO with inspection tours. Independently conduct smoke detector inspections and multiple dwelling surveys. This may require some walking and climbing of stairs.
3.	LECTURES - Prepare and present lectures to schools and interested groups on fire prevention. This may require some walking and standing.
4.	EXTINGUISHER DEMONSTRATIONS - Give extinguisher demonstrations to interested groups. Explaining operation while someone else does the actual operation. This may require some walking and standing.
5.	RECORD KEEPING - Record keeping in Fire Prevention Office. This requires filing and updating of records, answer telephones. Typing helpful but not essential. This may require some walking. No lifting or physical exertion involved.
6.	TRAINING EXERCISES - Under direction of Training Instructor, assist the Instructor by explaining training exercises and supervising same. Use of blackboard and projector when teaching. This may require some walking and standing. No lifting or physical exertion involved.
7.	RECORD KEEPING - Record keeping and filing of day to day records. Would assist the Training Instructor in preparing class lessons. This may require some walking and standing.
8.	CHIEF'S OFFICE - Answer telephones and assist in day to day record keeping, duty roster, sick records, etc. No physical exertion. This is a desk job.
9.	CHAUFFEUR - Chauffeur for chief officer(s). Shall transmit to the Shift Officers any orders given by the Chiefs, but in no case give orders unless authorized to do so. Upon return to quarters, shall submit a legible report to the Shift officer based on data gathered. Very little physical exertion. None of these duties ever require firefighting.
